COUPLES:

Loving Like Jesus (Part 2)

Husbands and wives can experience boundless joy by learning to love like Jesus, and a perfect example of that love occurred in the upper room prior to the crucifixion (John 13). On that occasion, no disciple dared to wash the feet of his brothers fearing it might be seen as a sign of inferiority. Even more disturbing, not one of them offered to wash Jesus' feet lest it be construed as an admission of lower rank than the others. Suddenly, Jesus rose from the table and did what the others considered beneath them.

They missed a special opportunity to serve because conventional wisdom said that the lesser serve the greater. Jesus showed them they had it backward. The greatest of all is the servant of all (Matt. 23:11). The apostles were His helpers, but by washing their feet, Jesus clarified what it means to be a leader in the church and in the home. Controlling others is a sign of insecurity and selfishness. Serving others is a sign of respect and love.

The Principle

Imagine if Jesus said to His Father, "Hold on a second. You want Me to do what? Why do I have to go to the cross? Why don't You go if You care so much about these people?"

Unlike sinful man, Jesus did not view service as demeaning or obedience as degrading. Members of the Godhead are not combatants or competitors. Though each fulfills a unique role, they work together in perfect harmony for the good of mankind.

Likewise, marriage is indeed a partnership; be sure to choose someone who is holy and wise. Marriage is also permanent so select someone who is thoughtful and kind. By choosing a Christian mate, you lay a solid foundation for your future happiness and effectiveness in God's service. But most of all, choose to be your best by loving your mate as Jesus loved His bride, the church.
