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Loving What Jesus Loves

Today, February 14, 2017, is very special. It is Valentine's Day, a day that we celebrate our love for our sweethearts, families and friends. I am so thankful for my loving wife and I rejoice in her everyday (Pro. 5:19). The church is the bride of Christ and our Lord loves His bride. Paul wrote, "Husbands love your wives, even as Christ also loved the church, and gave himself for it" (Eph.5:25). Each one of us should be interested in what Jesus loves, and whatever He loves we need to love, also.

Jesus loves the Father. A husband and wife could not be closer than God the Father and God the Son. Jesus stated, "I love the Father" (John 14:31). While on earth He continued to enjoy close communion with His Father for the Bible student often finds the Lord engaged in prayer (Mark 1:35). If we love that which Jesus loves, we will love the Father. Remember this exchange between our Lord and a lawyer.

Master, which is the greatest commandment in the law? Jesus said unto him, Thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy mind. This is the first and great commandment (Mat. 22:36-38).

How can we be intimate with our Father in Heaven? We can meditate on scripture (Psa. 1:1-3) and utilize prayer (Luke 18:1). God communicates to us through His word. We communicate to Him through prayer. A good relationship requires good communication. God does His part. Do we do our part?

Jesus loves the church. Even before the church was established (Acts 2), the church was always in the mind of God (Eph. 3:10,11). How much did Jesus love the church? He died to purchase the church (Eph. 5:25). Husbands should love their wives with the same sacrificial love that Jesus demonstrated for His bride. How could one ever denigrate the church when Jesus so willingly gave His life for it? Furthermore, salvation is found in the church of Christ and only in the church of Christ, for He is the Savior of the body (Eph. 5:23). Therefore, the church should be the object of our love and devotion. The hymn writer, Timothy Dwight, wrote concerning the church,

For her my tears shall fall, For her my prayers ascend;
To her my cares and toils be giv'n, Till toils and cares shall end.

Jesus loves people. "But when he [Jesus] saw the multitudes, he was moved with compassion on them" (Mat. 9:36). Jesus had so much mercy He died for the entire world (John 3:16). Our Lord was a people person. He preached to the masses and engaged individuals. If Jesus loved the people of the world, so should we. Loving the people of the world is different from loving an ungodly system also called the world (1 John 2:15-17). Jesus stated his mission when He said, "For the Son of man is come to seek and to save that which was lost" (Luke 19:10). That should be our mission, as well.

Jesus loves the Scriptures. In the wilderness temptation, the Lord defeated the Devil by quoting God's word. On another occasion, He said, "Search the scriptures; for in them ye think ye have eternal life: and they are they which testify of me" (John 5:39). If we love what Jesus loves, we will love the Holy Bible.

If we love what Jesus loves it is because we love Jesus. Listen to Him, "If you love me, keep my commandments" (John 14:15). "Ye are my friends, if ye do whatsoever I command you" (John 15:14). "And hereby we do know that we know him, if we keep his commandments" (1 John 2:3).

Do You Feel Spiritually Weak?

One dark winter evening, an elder made a trip to the country to visit a member who had missed assembling with the saints for several weeks. He found the member in his living room, sitting in front of a roaring fire in the fireplace. They passed a few pleasantries, and then both got quiet. The elder reached for a poker and used it to push a red hot ember out of the glowing fire and onto the hearth by itself. They both watched as the glowing ember faded, turned gray, then black. It died. The member looked at the elder and said, "I see your point. I'll be back Sunday."

A major purpose of our assemblies is to encourage one another, provoking one another to love and good works (Hebrews 10:24-25). One of the criteria that determines whether an activity is appropriate for the assembly is whether it edifies or builds up those who are present (1 Corinthians 14). It would be very difficult alone to maintain good morale and stay enthusiastic about the Lord and the good works to which He calls His saints.

The common meaning of *ecclesia*, the word translated "church" in the New Testament, is "assembly" (see Acts 19:32, 39, 41). Everett Ferguson correctly observes, "in assembly the church becomes itself." The *ecclesia* cannot cease to assemble and still be the *ecclesia* (The Church of Christ, Grand Rapids: Eerdmans, 1996, p. 235). The Lord knows we need each other; we will not make it on our own; so He calls us to come together for encouragement and remembrance.

In 1 Corinthians 11, the Lord's Supper is being discussed, the memorial Jesus gave His church to help us remember His body and blood, His body sacrificed, and His blood poured out for our sins. The Corinthians had so desecrated the Lord's Supper that what they did was not the Lord's Supper at all. Since they missed the meal's significance, it did not provide

them the spiritual sustenance for which the Lord had designed it. "Let a person examine himself, then, and so eat of the bread and drink of the cup. For anyone who eats and drinks without discerning the body eats and drinks judgment on himself. That is why many of you are weak and ill, and some have died" (vv. 28-39 ESV).

Do you find yourself spiritually ailing, spiritually weak, or maybe even spiritually dying? How are you and the communion feast getting along? Do you faithfully partake each Lord's Day? Are you spasmodic in attendance? Have you forsaken it altogether? Has the Lord's Supper become a meaningless ritual, something done perfunctorily, without bringing its purpose to mind? Has it become just a time to make out a check for the contribution or to plan where you are going for dinner or to check your watch to see whether we are still on time to get out within the hour?

The supper is designed to remind us of the Lord's death, from now until He comes again (1 Corinthians 11:26). Do you think about its significance? "But we see him who for a little while was made lower than the angels, namely Jesus, crowned with glory and honor because of the suffering of death, so that by the grace of God he might taste death for everyone" (Hebrews 2:9). "He is the propitiation for our sins, and not for ours only but also for the sins of the world" (1 John 2:2). "For our sake he made him to be sin who knew no sin, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God" (2 Corinthians 5:21).

A weekly reminder of Christ's sacrifice, which the Lord understood we needed, can fortify us to walk after the Spirit instead of the flesh. It can provide spiritual sustenance that will enable us to exercise our senses to discern good and evil and the strength to choose the good.

Conversely, missing the communion with Jesus and His church, whether by not being present for it or by failing to mentally participate if present, can lead to spiritual lethargy, illness and death.

“The Lord Jesus on the night when he was betrayed took bread, and when he had given thanks, he broke it, and said, ‘This is my body which is for you. Do this in remembrance of me.’ In the same way also he took the cup, after supper, saying, ‘This cup is the new covenant in my blood. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me’ ” (1 Corinthians 11:23-24 ESV). Listen to Jesus. Eat and drink in remembrance of Him.
